May 16: Michael Day Top Cars under the Stars, Olathe, KS




















Calendar of Upcoming Events 2025

Vice-President's Column

Hello MACC,

Replacing the TH350 with a 200R4 in a 1971 Chevelle: A DIY Guide

Recently, I began a project to replace the TH350 transmission in my 1971 Chevelle with a newly rebuilt 200R4. I chose the 200R4 because it's a direct-fit option that doesn't require a new driveshaft and, in many cases, doesn't require a new rear crossmember either.

Like many car projects, I dove right in. While I'm comfortable working with manual transmissions, this was my first time replacing an automatic. The process went relatively smoothly, but I did learn a few lessons along the way that I'd like to share here. I've put together a refined step-by-step guide that includes what I did, what I should have done, and tips that will help make the process easier for anyone doing a similar swap.

Tools & Equipment Needed

- Floor jack and jack stands
- Socket set and wrenches
- Transmission jack (recommended)
- Drain pan
- Screwdrivers
- Pry bar
- Replacement transmission
- New transmission fluid
- Transmission cooler lines (if damaged or worn)
- New transmission mount
- Possibly a new flexplate

Step-by-Step Process

1. Preparation

- Disconnect the battery.
- Safely lift the vehicle using a floor jack and secure it on jack stands.
- Remove the driveshaft by disconnecting it from the rear differential and sliding it out of the transmission.
- **Drain the transmission fluid.** (Note: I skipped this step initially and waited until the transmission was on the ground. It's much more difficult that way. Drain it beforehand.)

2. Disconnect Components

 Disconnect the shift linkage, vacuum lines, speedometer cable, and transmission cooler lines.



- Unbolt the torque converter from the flexplate. This is usually done through the starter opening or the torque converter access cover.
- Remove the exhaust system for more working room.
- Disconnect the emergency brake cable if it's in the way.
- Remove the transmission crossmember and support the transmission with a transmission jack.

3. Remove the Transmission

- Unbolt the bellhousing from the engine.
- Carefully lower the transmission and slide it back away from the engine.

4. Prepare for Installation

- Inspect and consider replacing:
 - o Flexplate
 - o Rear main seal (recommended while the transmission is out)
 - o Transmission mount
- Install the torque converter onto the new transmission. Ensure it's fully seated—you should feel it click into place multiple times.

5. Install the New Transmission

- Raise the new transmission and align it with the engine.
- Bolt the bellhousing to the engine block.
- Bolt the torque converter to the flexplate.
- Reinstall the crossmember, shift linkage, exhaust, emergency brake cable, cooler lines, dipstick tube, speedometer cable, and driveshaft.

6. Final Steps

- Fill the transmission with the correct type and amount of fluid.
- Reconnect the battery and start the engine.
- With the brake applied, shift through all gears to circulate the fluid.
- Check the fluid level again and inspect for leaks.

Tips & Lessons Learned

- Check compatibility. Make sure your replacement transmission matches your car's specs and needs.
- **Drain the fluid early.** It's much cleaner and easier while the transmission is still in the car.
- **Consider the cooler.** Replace or thoroughly flush the transmission cooler if you're reusing it.
- **Torque specs matter.** Always verify torque specs from a service manual rather than guessing.
